The Coronavirus Catch Up Premium provides financial assistance to maintained schools to support measures they implement to help students make up for lost teaching time during the periods of school closure. For mainstream schools the premium is calculated at £80 per child up to Y11. The premium does not have to be spent in the current financial year, but can be carried forward into 2021-22.

An initial allocation of £10,500 was received in autumn 2020. This represents 25% of the provisional allocation, based on the school roll at October 2019 census. Two further tranches are expected in spring and summer 2021, based on updated allocations using data from the October 2020 census.

As a school with a high level of deprivation - over 44% of students are eligible for Pupil Premium - we recognise the detrimental effects the school closures can have on students' learning and well-being. Our catch up priorities are:

- To remove barriers to learning that may disproportionately impact our disadvantaged students
- To continue to reduce the attainment gap between our disadvantaged students and their peers
- To ensure that knowledge gaps due to school closures are eliminated for all our students

The projected costs of our catch up plans, and the assessment of the expected impact on the educational attainment of our students is tabulated below.
